Summer Graduate Student Fellows Program

The program. The Robert Penn Warren Center for the Humanities offers graduate students in the College of Arts and Science the opportunity to participate in a summer Graduate Student Fellows Program. Warren Center Graduate Student Fellows will receive a \$4,500 stipend and will meet weekly or twice-weekly for two hours, from May 15 through June 9, 2006, at the Warren Center to give presentations based on their research. Each Fellow will be expected to give one seminar presentation and will be required to attend all seminar meetings. Occasional social events will be a part of the program as well. After the four-week series of seminar meetings, the remaining portion of the summer fellowship will be service-free.

Who is eligible? The Warren Center grants are intended for graduate students in the humanities or qualitative social sciences who are at the **advanced** stages of writing their dissertations. **Those selected as fellows may not hold other employment during the course of the summer-long fellowship.**

Application process. Please submit to the Warren Center (Box 1534 Station B) an application cover sheet (available at the Warren Center web site www.vanderbilt.edu/rpw_center), a four-page double-spaced description of the dissertation, a two-page bibliography, and a *curriculum vitae*. In your project description, please state clearly how much of the dissertation has been written, and how much writing you have left to complete. Also, two letters of recommendation should be sent to the Warren Center on behalf of your application. One of the letters should be from the dissertation director. Application deadline for the program is January, 11, 2006. The selection announcement will be made no later than the end of March. Submit application materials to the Graduate Student Fellows Program, Warren Center, Box 1534, Station B. ***Do not e-mail application materials, please.***
