

Instructions for mapping a drive to the EES2 server

PC Users:

1. Click on "My [Computer](#)" from Start menu.
2. Under the Tools menu choose "Map Network Drive".
3. [In the Drive box, choose](#) a drive letter, for example "H" for home drive.
4. In the [Folder](#) box type [\\EES2\your vunet id](#) for access to your personal folder or [\\EES2\anonymous](#) for access to the Anonymous folder.
5. [Uncheck](#) reconnect at logon and [click on "connect using a different username"](#).
You should then be at the [Connect](#) As dialogue box.
In the first box type [vanderbilt\your vunet id](#)
In the second box type your vunet id password.
6. Click "OK" and you should be connected to your network folder you chose in step 4. [Just click on "finish" in the Map Network Drive" dialog box. Your mapped drive should show up as another hard drive in "My Computer"](#).

If you turn your computer off, you will need to re-enter your password to reconnect to the mapped drive.

Mac Users Using OS 9x:

1. From the main menu bar go to the "Apple" menu.
2. Click on "chooser".
3. Highlight "Appleshare" and "A&S Geology".
4. EES2 Will appear under in the Select File Server box on the right.
5. In the next box choose "Microsoft Authentication v5.0" and click "ok".
6. You will then enter your VUNet ID for Name and your VUNet password.
(the require strong encryption (NTLMv2) checkbox should be checked)
7. Highlight EES2 Users and click "ok"
8. At the Welcome to EES2 box click OK.
9. The EES2 Users drive will appear on your desktop.
You will have access to all folders which do not have a belt around them.

Mac Users Using OS X: *

1. Under the Go menu select Connect to Server.
2. Highlight Appletalk, A&S Geology and EES2.
3. Click the Connect button in the lower right.
4. Enter your vunet ID and password in the Connect to Server box.
(the require strong encryption (NTLMv2) checkbox should be checked)
5. If you are asked for an address put in 129.59.120.69
6. Click Connect.
7. Highlight EES2 Users and click OK.
8. At the Welcome to EES2 box click OK.
9. The EES2 Users drive will appear on your desktop.
10. You will have access to all folders which do not have a red minus sign indicated.
